Thomas’ saga continues in *Giants in the Land Book Two*. An aging hero is thrown together with three lost souls who must find themselves amidst sudden and devastating change, overcome their own doubts and stand against the greatest evil ever to threaten the land.

The *Giants in the Land* series encourages young people to become giants in how they live, respond to difficulties and interact with others. It also seeks to help teens find hope and faith amidst sudden changes in their life.
